This year's Winter Cup National meet was held in conjunction with the Black Jack Invitational in Las Vegas. Jeff Crockett qualified to compete in the Winter Cup for the first time and really rose to the occasion. Jeff hit six of six routines and tied for 15th in the All-Around!! This is the highest any Husky has ever placed in this meet! Way to rock, Crock!! Jeff also qualified to finals on high bar where he ended up 7th!! A great meet for Jeff and all the purple and gold.

In the Black Jack Invitational, Seniors Ben MacColl and Aaron Cole led the way with pretty consistent routines. Scott Provence was injured after nailing his vault. This time he also nailed his heel. He is back practicing already, however. Graham Gordon did an outstanding job on floor and p-bars showing much improvement from the first meets.

In general, we are coming into competition form, nearly ready to peak for Collegiate Nationals in Denton, Texas. The competitions will be getting closer all through the season.

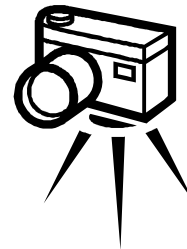

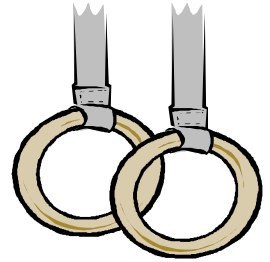

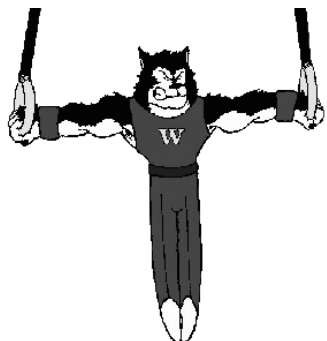
### *UW vs. ASU Home Meet Canceled*

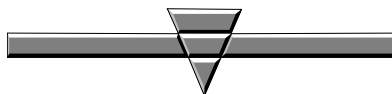
*Husky Senior Ben MacColl flying high above the High Bar at the US Air Force Academy for the Rocky Mountain Open*
